ENTER THE WAY YOU WANT TO



YOU HAVE A CHOICE OF WAYS TO JOIN THE ADE.

General Entry and Gap Year roles tend to be 'hands-on' and team orientated, and can be trade related. Officer roles are more management focused, requiring team leadership and decision making. If you're interested in joining the Reserves, you may have options regarding your method of entry, depending on the role you choose.

GENERAL ENTRY

- Requires completion of Year 10 (passes vary by role)
- No work experience necessary
- Fully-paid training, which may lead to nationally-recognised qualifications
- Qualified trade roles also available

OFFICER ENTRY

- Requires completion of Year 12 (passes vary by role)
- Some roles require a relevant qualification
- Degree courses can be fully or partly-funded by the ADF

GAP YEAR

- Choice of roles in the Navy, Army or Air Force
- A great opportunity to find out what life's like in the ADF
- Offers a fulfilling year of adventure, experiences, mateship, learning and travel


RESERVE ENTRY

- Choice of General Entry and Officer Entry roles
- Education requirements vary by role
- Flexible commitment to match your location and circumstances

BUT DO NOT YET MEET THE REQUIRED ENTRY STANDARDS.

A Defence Recruiter will determine your eligibility and suitability for a pathway and discuss your options with you during the application process.







THIS PROGRAM MAY BE OFFERED TO YOU IF YOU'VE BEEN SELECTED FOR A FULL-TIME OR RESERVE ROLE IN THE NAVY, ARMY OR AIR FORCE, BUT WOULD BENEFIT FROM CONFIDENCE AND RESILIENCE DEVELOPMENT AND/OR IMPROVED FITNESS BEFORE EMBARKING ON RECRUIT TRAINING.

During the application process a Defence Recruiter will talk to you about your options, and assess if this is the right pathway for you.

- Six-week residential course, held on a rotational basis at:
 - HMAS Cerberus, VIC.
 - Kapooka, NSW, or
 - RAAF Wagga, NSW.
- Open to all General Entry roles
- Requires a minimum fitness level of 4 push-ups, 20 sit-ups and 6.1
 Beep Test score

WHAT YOU'LL LEARN


Your training will include:

- Classroom based instruction
- Physical fitness development
- Team building activities
- Military site visits

WHERE IT WILL TAKE YOU

You'll leave the course with the skills, knowledge and confidence for success at recruit training and in your role in the Navy, Army or Air Force.





During the application process, a Defence Recruiter will talk to you about your options, and assess if this is the right pathway for you.

- Gives you a minimum of a TAFE Cert
 II in Skills for Work and Study
- Provides a five-month introduction to life in the Navy
- Open to all General Entry roles in the Navy
- Minimum fitness levels apply

- Language, literacy and numeracy
- Self-confidence and self-awareness
- Leadership and character development
- Physical fitness
- Military and seamanship skills

WHERE IT WILL TAKE YOU

You'll leave the course with the skills, knowledge and confidence to start your full-time job in the Navy.

ARMY INDIGENOUS DEVELOPMENT

PROGRAM (AIDP)

THIS PROGRAM MAY BE OFFERED TO YOU IF YOU WANT TO JOIN THE ARMY, BUT DO NOT CURRENTLY MEET THE GENERAL ENTRY STANDARDS.

You'll have the opportunity to undertake work-related training, and improve your fitness and understanding of Army life before you embark on recruit training.

During the application process a Defence Recruiter will talk to you about your options, and assess if this is the right pathway for you.

- Gives you a minimum of a TAFE Cert II in Foundation Skills
- Provides an introduction to life in the Army
- Open to all General Entry roles in the Army
- Minimum fitness levels apply

WHAT YOU'LL LEARN

Based at Kapooka, NSW, or Batchelor, NT you will train in the following areas:

- Language, literacy and numeracy
- Self-confidence and self-awareness.
- Leadership and character development
- Physical fitness
- Military skills

WHERE IT WILL TAKE YOU

You'll leave the course with the skills, knowledge and confidence to start your full-time job in the Army.



AIR FORCE INDIGENOUS

DEVELOPMENT OPPORTUNITIES

OPTIONS ARE AVAILABLE IF YOU WANT TO JOIN THE AIR FORCE, BUT HAVE BEEN UNABLE TO ATTAIN THE QUALIFICATIONS REQUIRED FOR GENERAL OR OFFICER ENTRY.

Suitable candidates may be offered assistance in accessing education opportunities that may lead to:

- Year 10 qualifications for General Entry as an Airman/Airwoman,
- Year 12 qualifications for (direct)
 Officer Entry or ADFA Entry as an officer through the Year 12
 Bridging Course
- A university degree for Graduate Entry as an officer through the Air Force Undergraduate Course

HOW IT WORKS

If selected, you join the Air Force, choose a suitable accredited education provider, have your fees paid for and earn a salary while you study. You'll gain valuable education qualifications,

receive a variety of support services including mentoring, and will have a guaranteed job in the Air Force on successful graduation from your course.


- Gives you a TAFE or university qualification that could include a trades apprenticeship
- Study at your local TAFE or university
- Provides access to medical and dental treatment
- Open to General Entry and Officer Entry roles
- Minimum fitness levels apply

WHERE IT WILL TAKE YOU

You'll gain the knowledge and qualifications to embark on a rewarding career in the Air Force.











FLEXIBLE ENTRY PATHWAYS MAY BE OFFERED TO YOU

IF YOU ARE KEEN TO START YOUR JOB IN THE ADF

AS SOON AS POSSIBLE, OR IF SERVING NEAR A SPECIFIC

LOCATION IS IMPORTANT TO YOU.

A Defence Recruiter will determine your eligibility and suitability, and discuss your options with you during the application process.

RECRUIT WHEN READY

This pathway may be offered to you if you've shown us you have what it takes, and are keen to get a job as soon as possible.


- Lets you start at a time that suits your lifestyle and personal circumstances
- Open to all General Entry roles
- Cannot be combined with IPRP, AIDP or NIDP pathways

RECRUIT TO AREA

This pathway may be offered to you if serving near a specific location is important to you, for reasons such as family commitments.

- First posting can be near your home or another desired place
- Available for first posting after completion of training
- Open to all General Entry roles
- Can be combined with IPRP, AIDP and NIDP (noting these programs are in designated locations throughout the year)
- Air Force pathways offer flexible study locations





ONCE YOU'VE CHECKED YOUR ELIGIBILITY TO SERVE. AND CHOSEN A ROLE (OR WOULD LIKE TO DISCUSS YOUR OPTIONS), YOU ARE JUST A FEW STEPS AWAY FROM AN EXCITING AND REWARDING ROLE IN THE ADF.

GENERIC APPLICATION PROCESS

YOU (YOUR OPPORTUNITIES UNLIMITED) SESSION

(Aptitude test and career counselling)

A YOU Session will determine your eligibility for General or Officer Entry, or a pathway program.

ASSESSMENT SESSION

(Medical examination, psychological review and job interview) An Assessment Session will confirm your suitability to commence a General or Officer Entry role, or a pathway program.
